

After graduating from the U of U, things seemed to be going good. I was doing what I had wanted to do for many years. Teaching college, working in the Patent Office and creating database software. But even with all the success, the money, the status, etc., I felt empty inside, like I was missing something. I would go out with colleagues and friends to relax and try to enjoy myself, have a few drinks, blow off some steam and live it up a bit. The relief only lasting a little while, then I needed something else.

The cycle of coping with life's pressures by drinking alcohol began to spin out of control and it wasn't long before I was looking for something stronger and quicker to numb me. Just a little bit of cocaine to get me going wouldn't seem to hurt, but there was never enough. Finally I turned to heroin to escape my misery, to feel nothing at all. I was in a downward spiral, fed by my addictions, which lead to poor performance at work, ending in deeper and deeper depression. After 30 years of the "slow fade" my colleagues seen me as a empty shell of a man who was no longer valuable to anybody. I was rightfully let go.

I heard of the Salt Lake City Mission's Second Chance Ranch and Christian Recovery Program. I now had to face facts. After two failed marriages, overdosing four times, four strokes and going through seven rehab. centers, I was destitute then. Now, I was willing to do whatever it took to change. I joined the program and soon felt like I was with family. A family that helps and encourages each other, one that loves everyone unconditionally. I began to feel free to share that I was abused as a child and felt ashamed of it. I listened to the words of Jesus, the Bible, godly teachers and counseling, then reality set in. There was real hope and freedom. My way of thinking was

changing into confidence in One who never changes, always keeps His word, and best yet, loves me just the way I am.

God was showing me His grace by giving His own Son to die for my sin. After receiving Jesus into my heart I was no longer concerned with keeping up with the world's idea of success. It set me free to accept myself and others just the way they are. I learned how to surrender it all to the living God and learned real forgiveness, patience, perseverance, and to how to put off the shame of what had been done to me and what I had done. I was a new creation with purpose, joy and confidence in my God.

Since completing the Second Chance Ranch, I've stayed in contact with those who know the Lord and taught me truth. I began attending a Bible teaching church, serving in the fellowship and leading a recovery group as time went on. It's been three years since I was at the ranch, but I thank God for it everyday. Today I'm working with the same software designers I had before. Times still get tough, stress still comes, but now I have someone real to turn to and friends who speak the truth, even when it hurts. I now know why I'm on this Earth. To serve the one true God by serving others.

Easy Ways to Help Us Raise Much Needed Funds

4. Pick up our self mailers from our Corporate offices and send them in letters to family and friends, explaining why you are donating and encouraging them to match your donation.

5. Pick up our self mailers and information from our Corporate offices and take a walk around your neighborhood. Visit all your neighbors and ask them for their support

encouraging them to match your donation.

6. Pick up our self mailers and information from our Corporate offices and take them to your work or business explain to your fellow workers why you donated to help feed the homeless and encourage your fellow workers' match your donation. Also if your work has a matching donation program encourage all your fellow workers to use it with their donations.

7. Arrange a dress-down day at work. Anyone dressing down will have to pay. Be sure you have a sign that says, "Please excuse our appearance today, we are dressing down to feed the homeless through Salt Lake City Mission . You could request donation of \$25 to \$50 or more per person to dress down. You could arrange these on a weekly or monthly basis.

8. Pick up our self mailers and information from our Corporate offices and take them to your Church, Club, School or any social group and explain to them why you are donating to help feed the homeless and encourage them to match your donation.

9. Pick up our self mailers and information from our Corporate Offices and hold a food, clothing, coat, sock, underwear, blanket, hygiene kit or toy drive. Be creative - Have fun with it - Whichever you choose you'll be a blessing to many and be blessed in turn.

The Gift of Real Estate

A vacant lot. A vacation home. A few acres of raw land. Many friends of the Salt Lake City Mission have real estate like this. They have property and they don't quite know what to do with it.

One possibility is to donate all or a portion of the property to the Salt Lake City Mission, either as an outright gift or in exchange for a lifetime of income.

Consider Mr. and Mrs. Rideout. They had two parcels of raw land that appraised at \$200,000. They purchased it years ago, thinking they might farm and build a house on it someday. That plan never materialized, but they continue to hold the land.

They thought of selling it more than once, but the idea of paying capital gains tax on the sale slowed them down. Also, they are overwhelmed just thinking about all the time and trouble it would take to market and sell the property. And so they just let it sit there.

Then they learned that the Salt Lake City Mission was willing to receive the land and use it or sell it to help the homeless. They were also pleased to discover that they would receive a \$200,000 income tax deduction for the gift.

Another person Mr. Hagga, discovered that the vacant lot he owned. Could be donated to the Salt Lake City Mission, sold and the proceeds used to help the homeless. He was equally surprised by the large tax deduction that he received.

Another couple, the Blues, gave a vacation home to a Charity in trust, and made arrangements to receive income from the trust for the rest of their lives. Like the Rideouts, they avoided capital gains tax and obtained an immediate income tax charitable deduction.
