Message from the Co-Director Joe Vazquez

This is the question we have been asking ourselves; How did we make it this far in the face of unprecedented crisis. Together, we have accomplished so much this year in the face of the Covid-19 hardships.

We have provided more food to individuals and families in need than ever before, making adjustments all along the way. Our Outreach Program actually grew as we altered our normal routine to provide food box meals and daily sack meals "curbside/drive thru" fashion for safety. We simply decided to step in to make the difference by setting up a food distribution center outside behind our offices. Suddenly we were operational again. Simple process, but not always easy handling all the issues of handing out food during a pandemic. All of our holiday outreaches, beginning with Mother's Day up to Labor Day saw record numbers people coming to us for help.

This year's Back to School Giveaway was a tremendous success. Not only did we have multiple new partners (Vida Nueva Church, Casa de Dios Church, Centro Christiano Monte de Santidad Church, La Placer and Mi Preferidad radio stations, and Tri-City Exchange) but also our friends at Calvary Chapel, all worked in partnership to help more families and children than ever before.

we surround them with, success is almost a sure thing for most of these guys", say Pastor Paddy, Men's Program Director. "Since the COVID crisis hit, we all have been working extra hard to provide the food that has become vital to so many people caught unaware by the pandemic. A lot of man hours and heavy lifting have been the normal lately, say Pastor Joe Vazquez, CO-Director. "To give the men a break and experience something completely relaxing and fun we sent the men out with Pastor Paddy on a camping trip to Como Springs Resort in Morgan, Utah.

Pastor Paddy recalls, "We arrived at the campsite before noon and spent the initial

time setting up tents and getting familiar with the camp grounds. We then had a nice lunch of hotdogs and hamburgers. After lunch on the first day we began a time of games and activities, dubbed 'The Salt Lake City Mission Olympics'. We did many fun and silly things like a spoon relay, frisbee golf, bean bag toss, etc. The winners of each event got a day off from work therapy as the prize for winning the contests."

Pastor Paddy continues, "Other times while camping included relaxing around the campsite, walking in the woods, or swimming in a pond nearby. The camp site lent us a fire ring and sold us some firewood which we supplemented with

dead wood around the campsite. We sat around the fire at night enjoying the cool night air and the warmth of the fire."

Along for the experience was Pastor Shawn, the Mission's Chaplain who engaged the men giving them an inspirational message. Some of the men wanted to be baptized. Pastor Paddy and Pastor Shawn conducted the baptisms in the pond on the property as the other men served as witnesses.

"Overall, the men had an enjoyable time. For some of them, this was the first time they had ever been camping. For others, the sound and peace of nature was its own reward".

WRAP UP Summer outreach events helped tens of thousands struggling Utah residents

Throughout the Summer the Mission held food box giveaways on numerous major holidays, partnered to host "The Annual Back to School giveaway" (which helped more than 6,500), continued its daily outreach to the homeless and hungry, and became a major distribution center also providing vital food items to many local service providers - as we all joined together to care for those financially stressed and caught unaware by the COVID-19 CRISIS. Together we are "meeting thier greatest needs!"
